What is Encore Cleveland?

The Encore movement is a national effort to leverage the energy and experience of Americans who seek to fill community needs upon retirement or near the end of their primary careers. Encore Cleveland was launched in 2013 by the Cleveland Foundation, which helps to connect and fund a network of organizations to provide experienced Greater Clevelanders with an array of meaningful opportunities in the community.

- **Encore Clevelanders** benefit from the opportunity to remain active and engaged through work in their community that provides personal fulfillment.

Encore Facts:

- To date, the Cleveland Foundation has awarded more than \$1 million in grant dollars to support Encore Cleveland programs.
- Cuyahoga County's age profile is steadily increasing. Between 2000 and 2050, the percentage of individuals aged 50 and older is expected to increase 66 percent.
- Individuals are living longer, healthier lives. Many are living an additional 20-30 years post retirement.
- According to Encore.org, top labor economists predict that within the next eight years, there could be at least 5 million potential job vacancies in the United States. This labor shortage could limit the growth of needed services and cost the economy as much as \$3 trillion over the five-year period beginning in 2018.
- A 2008 *MetLife Foundation/Civic Ventures Encore Career Survey,* conducted by Peter D. Hart and Associates, shows that most people expect to work longer than previous generations, but that half of those aged 44-70 want Encore careers that combine personal meaning, continued income and social impact.
